We are undertaking an exciting research project titled: Diversity in Art Education (DIVA): Visual Art Education and Global Understandings.

Once you have considered the scenario you will be invited to share (via the online survey tool) a series of 5 images that represent your views of what art education should be about and provide a one sentence explanation about what each image represents or stands for.

The survey will take 20-30 minutes to complete (not including your thinking or preparation time). Your participation in this research is voluntary and you have the right to withdraw at any point during the survey, and your data will be removed, at your request up until one month of the conclusion of the data gathering phase – 1 April, 2022.

This project will be significant as it will provide an opportunity for ITE visual art educators from many parts of the world to outline what they think Visual Art Education should be about! The data will enable us to discover and share the diverse views of visual art educators. Similarly, it will contribute to understandings and generate dialogue around Visual Art Education.
